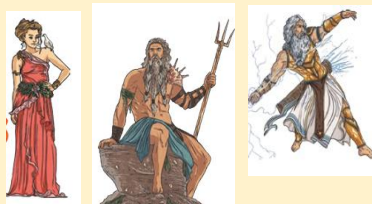
Parents/Carers: Homework is an important part of learning. Please support your child by helping them, sitting with them, and showing interest in what they are learning.

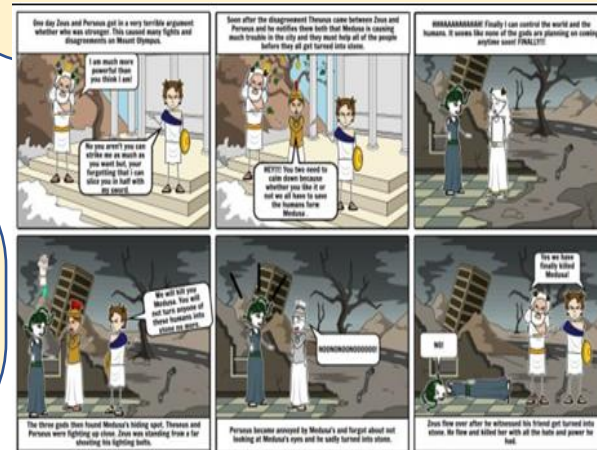

Essential Weekly Homework Expectations



Reading:

Children should read at home at least 3 times a week and their reading must be logged on Page Ticker at least 3 separate times each week.

 Every time reading is logged 3 times a week, children receive an entry ticket into our class end-of-term reading raffle! Regular reading boosts vocabulary, spelling knowledge, comprehension skills, inspires the imagination, and supports learning across all subjects.






Times Tables:

Times tables are the building blocks of all maths! Regular practice supports addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, fractions, percentages, and problem-solving.

Using **TT Rockstars** little and often helps children gain confidence, improve fluency, and recall facts quickly in lessons. The more fluent they are, the easier and more enjoyable maths becomes!



  **Spellings:** Children should practise their spellings frequently each week.  learning spellings help improve writing, reading, and overall literacy. Spellings are assessed in school to track progress and support their learning.
